



AUGUST DEMONSTRATION by David Scott



Well known for his robust and large size turning our member David Scott demonstrated how he makes multiple copies of items. These can be balustrade posts, four faced vases or similar. After making an accurate jig, as above, with four pieces and four spaces he turns the four pieces to a desired shape e.g. as in the photo. He then inserts four pieces in the spaces and holds these in position with screws. When this is turned in the lathe the ghosting will show where to take away the material until the ghosting stops. These four pieces now have one face completed and are turned around 90 degrees in the jig to have the next face completed. By this process the four faces can be cut and all will be the same.

By taking out the pieces from the jig and placed individually in the lathe the circular tops can be formed.

David also showed us his large bowl scraper made from an arc of a circular saw blade with a handle attached.
