Welcome to Talking Turning for October 2019

Last meeting we had an excursion to Robbo's (Ian Robertson) workshop in Tooradin. Robbo is a professional wood turner who has put so much back into the wood turning community through demonstrations, attending woodturning weekends and donating 2 day training sessions at each woodturning weekend he attends. Our guild visited along with a crew from Warragul to learn about production and copy turning. Many tricks of the trade were learnt and we were amazed at the speed and ease that Robbo was able to turn out a piece. It was unfortunate that many had other



commitments in the afternoon as the demonstration continued after lunch when what we had learnt was out to the test with an inter club challenge to see which club could produce the closest copy of a table leg.

The final session of this series of Learn to Turn took place on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> October. Robbo has many lathes including this beautiful Wadkin






He showed us various ways of finding the centre of square piece of timber when, using a centre finder, marking gauge and a jig which



is particularly quick when doing production turning. Notice the screw in the middle of the square.in pic on right.
















Robbo used an existing leg to make a story board which allows him to quickly mark where the important shape and diameters change. He showed various shapes that you can make in the transition from square to round and then onto the turning using only gouges and a Skew.
